

Licence to Drive Multi Combination Vehicle

AGB Training currently offers Licence to Drive Multi Combination Vehicle.

This unit involves the skills and knowledge required to obtain a licence to drive a multi-combination vehicle. It includes systematically and efficiently controlling all vehicle functions, monitoring traffic and road conditions, managing vehicle condition and performance, coupling and uncoupling dollies, and effectively managing hazardous situations.

Types of multi-combination vehicles include a heavy combination B-double rated vehicle at least 22 metres in length with more than one trailer, which has all pertinent documentation permits etc. or a three axle prime mover with an A and B trailer each with bogie axles.

Assessment of this unit will be undertaken within a licensing examination conducted by, or under the authority of, the relevant state/territory driver licensing authority.

This short course is made up of a unit taken from **TLI31216 Certificate III in Driving Operations**.

Entry Requirements:

You must have held a current Australian HR, HC or a combination of a HR and a HC vehicle licence for at least 12 months, plus completion of an approved course.

Manual experience is preferred.

AGB Training requires the applicant to successfully complete

- Language Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Assessment
- Pre-Training Review
- Enrolment Application Form

If you are taking any prescribed medication or have a medical condition AGB requires a medical clearance form that is available from VicRoads. The forms can be downloaded from the VicRoads website.
